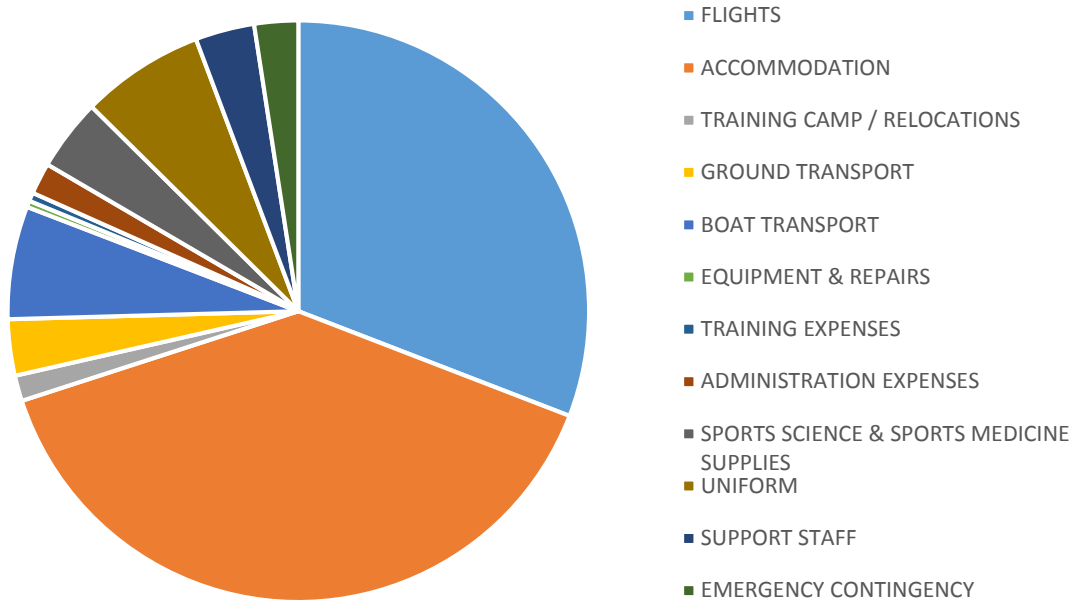




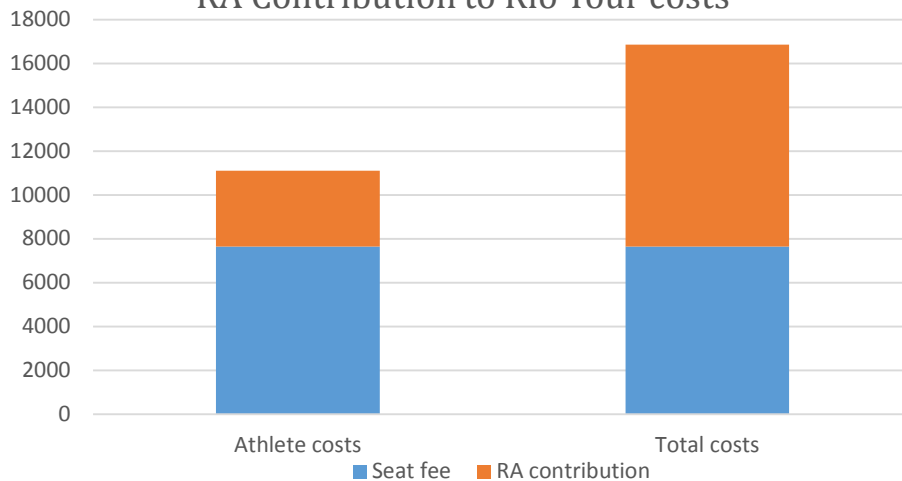

The total cost (including junior seat fee contribution) to send a junior athlete to the Junior World Rowing Championships in Rio de Janeiro is \$16, 862 AUD. Rowing Australia contributes \$9,292 AUD towards each athlete’s total cost.

In addition, Rowing Australia has a partnership with Singapore Airlines, which over the last four years (including this year) has seen RA provide 52 Singapore Airlines tickets to the State Rowing Associations for them to auction off as part of their fundraising efforts to help their underage athletes to raise funds for their tours.
